About the Nature Play Area

The <u>Eco Experience</u> is presented by the Minnesota State Fair and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA). <u>Fireflies Play Environments</u>, <u>Landscape Renovations</u>, and <u>Crows Nest Design</u> have created an open-ended, creative, and beautiful adventure playground at the Eco Experience. The MPCA is coordinating volunteers for this area.

Pretend Play with the Sand Kitchen and Water Towers

The sand area has a sand kitchen, which is a simple wood structure, and sand toys to promote constructive and social play. Children will also be able to play and cool off in a small stream of running water and a kid water tower.
